

DIVISION 72 PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES

(Current as of 1/11/2022)

Remote Appearances (Appearing by Zoom)

All court proceedings in Division 72 are currently noticed to occur in person at the Volusia County Courthouse, 101 N. Alabama Avenue, <u>Courtroom 3A</u>, Deland, Florida. However, due to the current public health situation, the Court will permit anyone wishing to appear by Zoom for their in person court hearing to do so. You must contact the Court's Judicial Assistant, Karen Lloyd at <u>klloyd@circuit7.org</u> to receive the Zoom Meeting ID. *This does not apply to jury trials, which must still be attended in person by all parties, counsel, and witnesses, unless otherwise ordered by the Court.*

Please note, the above blanket permission to appear remotely is subject to change based upon future change(s) in circumstances.

Written Plea Forms

The use of written plea forms is only required by the Court when the sentence to be imposed includes probation.

Scheduling Hearings

All hearings must be scheduled with the Court's Judicial Assistant, Karen Lloyd email at klloyd@circuit7.org. Counsel and parties attempting to schedule a hearing must make reasonable efforts to coordinate the hearing date and time with the other side. Failure to do so may result in the Court cancelling the hearing without further notice.

Docket Sounding

Docket sounding will be held the Friday immediately preceding the trial week scheduled for the case. The Court will not accept negotiated pleas <u>after</u> docket sounding absent extraordinary circumstances. All parties and their counsel are required to attend docket sounding, regardless of whether the announcement at Pretrial Conference was "Ready for Trial" or "Pass to Plea."

Jury Trials

All parties and counsel for all cases scheduled for jury trials during a given trial week must appear on the first day of jury selection for a given trial week and must remain until excused by the Court. Counsel and parties are advised to be prepared to select a jury on any day of the assigned trial week.

Waiver of Appearance and Plea to Resolve the Criminal Case

If you have been charged with a crime in Volusia County, you may be able to resolve your case with a plea and waiver agreement without appearing in person. Contact your lawyer or the State Attorney's Office for more information. If you cannot afford a lawyer, the Court can appoint a lawyer to represent you. You can apply for the services of the Public Defender by filling out an affidavit of indigency available at the Clerk of Court's Office at the Courthouse, or online at www.pd7.org/applications/

**Please note – you must still attend your scheduled court date even if you decide to pursue the plea and waiver option, unless you are excused by the Court. To be excused from your court date, you must file a request for more time in writing and file it with the Clerk of Court before your scheduled court appearance. If you fail to appear for your scheduled court date without being excused by the Court, a warrant will likely be issued for your arrest.
