

Flager County Courtroom Presentation Technology

Each courtroom is equipped with three large TVs, two facing the gallery and one facing the Jury Box (except courtroom 101). In addition, Jury Box is equipped with two small monitors and a monitor on the witness stand for viewing.

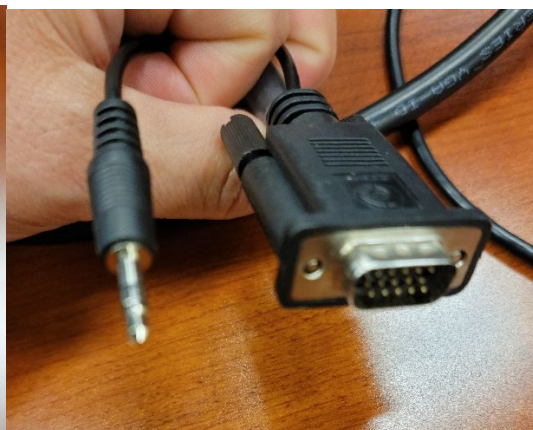
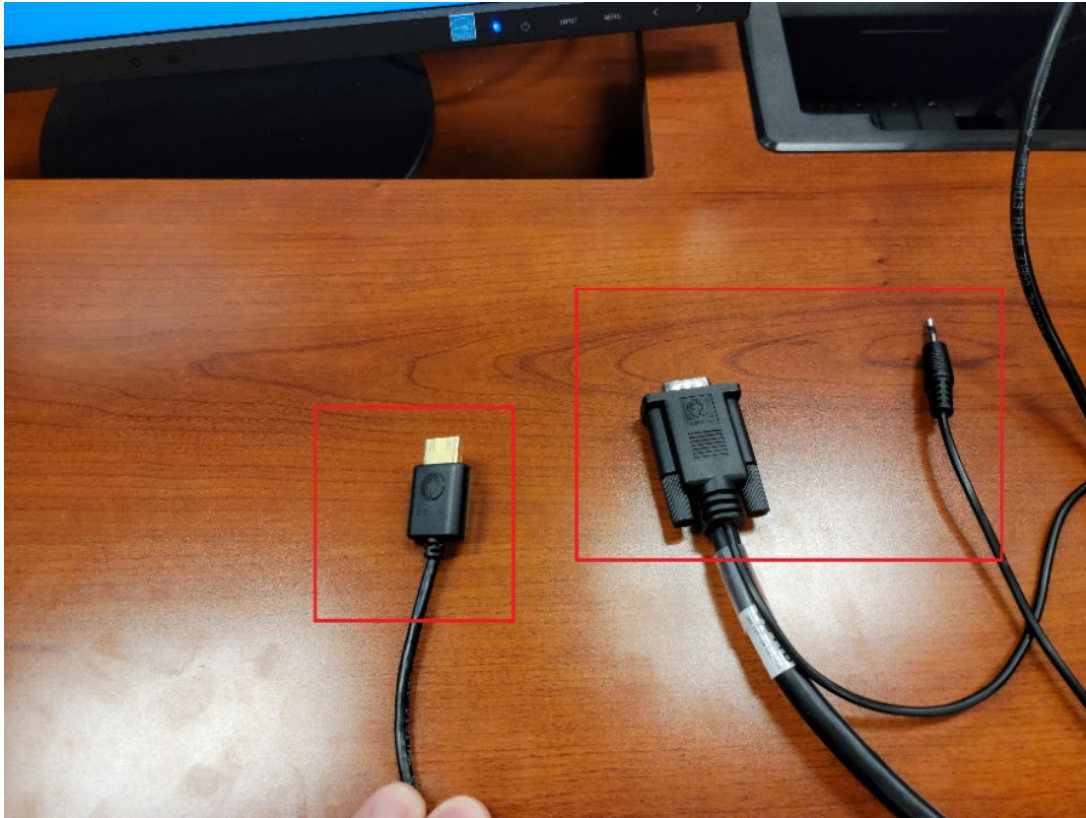
TV FACING THE JURY BOX AND WITNESS MONITOR

At the podium in each courtroom, there is a connection point with an HDMI cable and a VGA Cable/Audio Aux jack. The HDMI cable also carries audio.



Please note that if you need to display from a device at the counsel tables instead of the podium, you must supply your own extension cable.

An HDMI extension cable (which has one female end and one male end).



An HDMI coupler (which has 2 female ends) plus a second cable (HDMI).



You will be responsible for securing any cables that run across the floor, but you may **NOT** use tape with a heavy adhesive like duct tape. Instead, we recommend a Velcro-type covering, a molded channel, or tape that will not leave a glue residue or otherwise mar the carpeting, such as a light-duty gaff tape (often labeled as “easy release,” “clean release,” or something similar).

The output from your laptop or other device connected at the podium is sent to the screen from the Judge’s touch panel on the bench.

****Users should test their equipment before the hearings as Court Technology cannot support users’ devices and Wi-Fi.**
